## The IB programme

Next to the exam for the regular stream you will take the IB exam English A: Language and Literature. Be aware that although you do the same components as other students for the regular VWO exam you may do these in different periods than the other students. Have a good look in your FER.

All the written work for the IB will be assessed by external moderators.

The Further Oral Activity, which you did in year 5, and the Individual Oral Commentary in year 6 are assessed by your teachers. The Individual Oral Commentary is also recorded and sent abroad for moderation. The same oral will also be marked by your teachers for the regular VWO exam, using the regular VWO assessment criteria. The latter also applies to the School Exam on writing. You will be writing a mock Paper 2, and be marked for regular VWO writing skills, using the regular VWO assessment criteria.
